## **Introduction:**

Since inception in 1982, an organization called “Janeev” [Awareness] is thriving to uplift the deprived class of the society, which has been away from development for the last 58 years of independence. To achieve this goal one has to work on various sectors of society. Hence in 1985 Janeev has formed a trust called Vanchit Vikas

{ Upliftment & Development of the deprived community }to experiment it’s ideology.

Over a last decade Vanchit Vikas has created a niche for itself by working on various sectors of the society simultaneously.

Maharashtra and MadhyaPradesh are the states where Vanchit Vikas presently concentrates the work. Mainly we deal with the problems of Women and Children {Including commercial sex workers and their children}, Farmers, Land laborers, backward class, tribal people and poor class in urban area.

Vanchit Vikas works in order to bring social change in the society. There are about 18 ongoing projects of Vanchit Vikas, which are as follows:

## **Neehar**

### **[Home For The Rehabilitation of The Children of Prostitutes]**

#### **Introduction:**

Bodies of the women have long been considered as a commodity for sexual use. For many women, sex work provides the sole means of earning a regular income. Many deserted women, widows, poor women, other needy, destitute women; devdasis are working as sex workers. Most of them are forced into the profession. Their living and working conditions are very bad. All these prostitutes are exploited, they are victims of poverty and superstitions, no proper ventilation, unhygienic atmosphere, less water, lack of nutritious food, diet, compulsion of addiction and other bad habits...every thing in the area is worst. They are suffering from various disease and from HIV /AIDS also. Most of them are illiterate. They have borrowed money from the brothel owner on very high rate of interest and this is the reason why they could not escape from the red light area. All of them are addicted of tobacco, alcohol etc. they have no future, they are dependant on destiny.

In India by law, any women can do the prostitution for her livelihood. But the law says that the use of other women for prostitution is not permissible. Brothel keepers are using this law for their own benefit.

If we know this situation, then we all will understand that why rehabilitation of prostitute is difficult.

These women stay in the area along with their children.

While working in this area, we realized one thing that the children are nothing to do but wasting their life and time by doing nothing, but coming across such things that they are not suppose to do or see. We were thinking on these lines. If we take out these children from the area then only they will have good future and proper rehabilitation is possible. Therefore we have started “ Neehar” in 1989. It is located at Lohgaon village 18 kms away from Pune station, near

airport. Neehar is a basically Sanskrit word, it means that dew drops, who are shaping to have a good/bright future. Priority is given to the girl child at the time of admission. Sterilization of the mother is essential for her children admission at Neehar.

At present Neehar is containing 60 girls and 17 boys. The age group of children is 3-18 yrs.

Neehar is a like a home for the children where they get love, care and affection. Children are provided with all the facilities. They attend nearby local schools, participates in various activities, competition and won the prizes. Some of them are toppers in their class. Children who have passed out SSC examination are studying in reputed colleges. We provide vocational training in knitting, tailoring, artificial jewellery and other handicrafts.

### **Objectives**

- 1 To rehabilitate the children of the commercial sex workers to overcome their problems and to lead normal, healthy and productive life.
- 2 To develop their personality.
- 3 To strive for their acceptance in the society as normal citizens.
- 4 To provide educational opportunities.
- 5 To support the children to enjoy their livelihood
- 6 To enable these children to be financially independent and then provide a good life for their mothers in their old age.
- 7 To support the girls to stay away from entering into the profession of prostitution.
- 8 To support this deprived group to develop as good citizens of society in India.

### **Working strategy**

- 1 All children are medically examined at the time of admission at the admission at Neehar.
- 2 All mothers are motivated to undergo sterilization.
- 3 All children are motivated to go to the school with normal children in the near by local school.
- 4 All are given opportunities to take part in extra curricular activities & sports.
- 5 Medical examination conducted once in a month.
- 6 A special attention provided to all children so that they will get marks in their academics.
- 7 These children do not have any family background. They have faced traumatic situation in their early childhood stage. Their birth is itself a trauma for the mother and child. Experiences faced knowingly or unknowingly or in their subconscious mind are the barriers in their overall development. Therefore it is essential to take care of their physical, emotional as well as mental status. Counseling will play very Important role in the personality development of the children.

### **Impact**

- 1 All children of Neehar are getting better education and normal standard of living like other school going children.
- 2 Those who completed their secondary education had taken vocational training and thus earning good income. Vanchit Vikas always motivates them.
- 3 All girls motivated to do recognized jobs and not to enter into their mother's profession.
- 4 Successful rehabilitation of 23 girls and 12 boys.
- 5 Over the past years Vanchit Vikas is trying to create a mass social change in the form of Neehar and has achieved to certain extent.
- 6 We are proud to say that we have put an example by undertaking this challenge by developing and maintaining a home for the rehabilitation of the children of prostitutes. With our inspiration, various other social organizations have now started this kind of rehabilitation center.
